



The New London Police Department would like to make the public aware that in order for a person to be selling products door-to-door, the person must hold a valid State Hawker and Peddler License, in compliance with RSA 320. Furthermore, the person selling their goods must produce that License upon request. If you are concerned with someone at your front door, you are under no obligation to answer the door. ## Conservation Commission plans second tree cutting at Low Plain

The New London Conservation Commission is developing plans to conduct a second tree cutting at the Esther Currier Wildlife Management Area at Low Plain. The first cut, which took place in January of 2017, was a success. Like the first phase, this second cut would support an important element of the forestry-management plan for the property. The new cut will focus on clearing diseased and densely grown trees from the south-western portion of the land. The cut would, like the first, promote forest health and help attract a variety of wildlife.

## CEREMONIAL FLAGS AT WHIPPLE MEMORIAL HALL



A new exhibition was installed as part of the Whipple Hall Centennial on June 23. Ceremonial flags on staffs had occupied wall niches since 1923, but in 2006 the UV-damaged flags were removed and placed in protective storage to prevent their total loss.

For this display, the Town Archives photographed each flag and printed the images on two fabric banners, accompanied by wall labels explaining their history and significance.

## TAX MAPPING PROJECT

As previously mentioned in last issue's "Municipal Matters" we are nearing completion of the tax mapping project. Undoubtedly some acreages and parcel lines will change based best mapping standards using the most accurate survey, deed and plan information. Properties that will be most affected are those where no survey was ever done or where deeds describe parcels of land as "containing acreages plus or minus". Please keep in mind this process will be on-going. There is no absolute deadline. If you have information that contradicts the mappers findings you can provide that information when it is convenient for you to do so. Many property owners go south for the winter. We understand that you will not necessarily be available during the winter months to meet with us. We will be posting the tax map changes to our website, so you can review the maps and provide feedback in person, over the phone, by e-mail or regular mail.
