The New London Police Department is excited to announce the addition of the newest member of the police department, K9 Vilo! Officer Josh Fisher was matched with K9 Vilo on May 30, 2017. K9 Vilo was purchased from Connecticut Canine Services and was selected from a group of six other canines. The bond between Officer Fisher and K9 Vilo was immediately apparent and strong.

Officer Fisher and K9 Vilo are scheduled to attend the Vermont Police Canine Academy Patrol School starting on July 10, 2017. In an effort to acclimate K9 Vilo to the working environment, community members may see Officer Fisher in the K9 cruiser with Vilo before he attends the patrol school. Officer Fisher and K9 Vilo will be patrol certified by November 2017. A special thank you from Chief Andersen of NLPD to Chief Cahill of Sunapee PD for their generous donation of equipment for the canine cruiser.

Officer Fisher and the entire New London Police Department is incredibly grateful to the community for their support in achieving this goal. There's a New Trail in Town

The Town of New London, New London Hospital and Eversource have partnered to create a walking trail that connects Newport Road, Parkside Road and the Lyon Brook Trail. The trail runs from Newport Road near the WNTK building, along the utility right-of-way towards Parkside Road. Before reaching Parkside, it enters the woods and runs parallel to Parkside and then connects to the existing Lyon Brook Trail. The resulting one-mile loop, with connections to the hospital parking lot and Outing Club will provide in-town opportunities for walkers, joggers and commuters. The trail was constructed by the Conservation Commission with assistance from the Highway Department.

Hospital Community Trail GRAND OPENING HIKE will be held on Tuesday, June 13th at noon.


